Word	Definition
Guru	spiritual teacher or leader The word 'guru' means something that takes you from darkness to light.
Spiritual	relating to people's thoughts and beliefs, rather than physical things
ignorance	lack of knowledge or information
wisdom	knowing what is right or wrong and understanding how to make good choices
equality	treating everyone fairly and with the same respect, regardless of their characteristics
compassion	caring about other people and wanting to help them when they are hurt or in need
