Our topic this term is all about being Outdoor and Adventurous.

We will be learning about rivers in Geography and living things and their habitats in science.

To support this, we will be visiting Castleshaw to learn first-hand how the river system works.

We will be reading a selection of nature poetry by Joseph Coelho, the Just So Stories by Rudyard Kipling and a selection of recounts to help us write our own versions.

We will be creating our own outdoor sculptures, inspired by Andy Goldsworthy, in art.

In maths we will be covering a range of objectives, including place value of numbers up to 10,000,000, formal methods of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, common factors and multiples, and square, cube and prime numbers.

PE days:

Class 12- Tuesday and Wednesday.

The school P.E. kit is a white t-shirt, black shorts/leggings and black pumps. Trainers and black jogging pants can be worn in cold weather.
